

Planned Giving Stewardship

- Decades-long process
- Likelihood of gift realization during your tenure = low
- Requires a well-documented plan

Stewardship of new donors

- Proper documentation
- Prompt & ongoing thanks
- Annual visits (where feasible)
- Ongoing communication
- Volunteer engagement

Stewardship of existing donors

- Assess the landscape
- Visits & documentation

Maintain communication

Treat them like a new donor

Record Keeping

- Which documents will you use?
- Where & how will you store them?
- Who can access the files?

How else will you document the relationship?
