You continued to focus on matters of governance through the remainder of your Board tenure, chairing the Governance Committee in 2012 and 2013, and serving on the Nominations Committee in those same years. As chair of this year's Nominations Committee, you continue to bring your keen awareness of ADRP's needs to bear on the selection of future volunteer leaders.

In 2012 you started to diversify your service when you became involved with two very important projects. The first was the creation of ADRP's content archive; the second, the launch of the fledgling Education Committee. In both cases you worked closely with a co-lead to identify needs and develop a plan. From these foundations that you helped to build, we launched the online ADRP Knowledge Center and implemented a presenter mentoring program in 2013.

In your final year on the Board, 2013, you partnered with a co-lead yet again to bring into sharp focus the practices and tools that need to be put into place to ensure that every ADRP volunteer has a great experience and is appropriately recognized for her or his service. Finally, you convened a talented team of volunteers to present the 2014 ADRP Central Ohio Regional Conference: "Tell Impactful Stories."
