You became ADRP Treasurer in 2007 and have held that office for six years. You leveraged your knowledge of good record keeping practices so that we could determine whether we had net income or a net loss. You created our online registration and payment capabilities. Even as your own career progressed, you made the time to provide effective and gracious customer service to ADRP members, whether you were in the office, on the road, or on vacation. You served our members in a way that allowed them to fully participate in their own growth.

Your extraordinary leadership deservingly furthered your own career. After establishing the donor relations department at Syracuse University and leading its evolution for a decade, you were one of the first recognized donor relations experts to become a frontline fundraiser. As Assistant Dean you are a role model for others who have made this transition, which is now an increasingly common career path for donor relations professionals.
